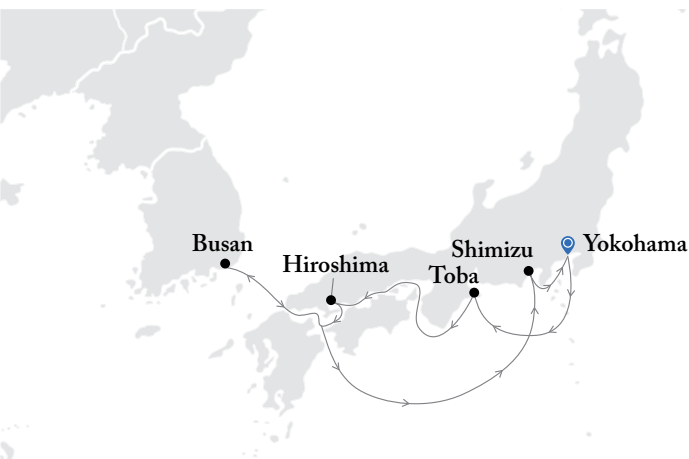

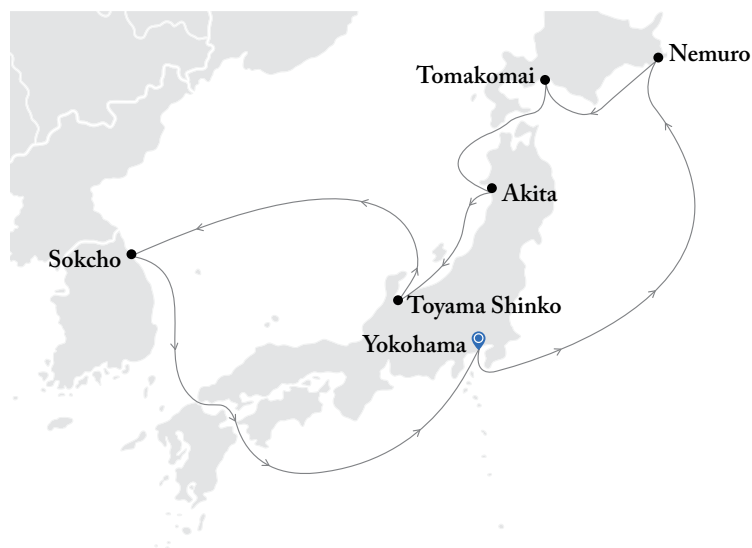

## Aomori

Aomori, located at the northern tip of Japan's main island, is known for its fresh air, scenic landscapes, and deep cultural traditions. Surrounded by mountains and the ocean, the city offers beautiful year-round views. Aomori is famous for the Nebuta Festival, where giant illuminated floats light up the summer nights. The region is also Japan's leading producer of apples, offering flavorful varieties and fresh apple-based treats. Visitors can also enjoy excellent seafood—especially scallops and tuna—as well as local crafts and museums.

## Akita

Akita is the capital city of Akita Prefecture, located in the northern Tohoku region of Japan. It sits along the coast and is known for its natural beauty, traditional culture, and relaxed lifestyle. A major highlight is the Akita Kanto Festival in August, where performers balance towering bamboo poles with glowing lanterns, creating a breathtaking night display and showcasing strong local craftsmanship. Akita is also known for excellent rice, high-quality sake, and regional dishes like Inaniwa-udon noodle or kiritanpo.

## Beppu

Beppu is a welcoming coastal city in southern Japan's Kyushu region, famous for its remarkable hot-spring landscape. The city is one of the world's leading geothermal destinations, offering thousands of steaming vents and natural thermal pools. A highlight is the "Jigoku Meguri," or Hell Tour, where visitors can see colorful and powerful hot springs, including bright blue ponds, bubbling mud, and dramatic geyser rising from the ground. Beppu's seaside setting also provides fresh seafood, while the area's volcanic soil produces unique local ingredients.

## Hososhima

Visit the seaside Oomi-jinja Shrine, dedicated to the sun goddess Amaterasu, where sacred straw ropes face the sea to ward off evil spirits. Venture to Hyuga Cape and Umagase, a breathtaking natural wonder featuring towering cliffs and hexagonal rock formations. The panoramic views from the Skelutcha Viewing Deck offer a thrilling perspective of the Pacific, making it a must-see for nature lovers and photographers alike.



## Ofunato

Situated on the southern coast of Iwate Prefecture, Ofunato enjoys a mild climate—pleasantly cool in summer and rarely snowbound in winter. The area is home to stunning coastal scenery within the Sanriku Fukko National Park and an abundance of fresh seafood. A short journey inland brings you to Hiraizumi, a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site since 2011, where beautifully preserved temples, gardens, and ruins reflect the ancient Buddhist vision of paradise.

## Hamada

Nestled on the Sea of Japan coast, Hamada offers travelers a rich blend of spiritual heritage and scenic charm. Journey inland to the revered Izumo Taisha Shrine, one of Japan's oldest and most sacred Shinto shrines, famed for its architecture and its role in the mythology of matchmaking and creation. In Hamada itself, visit a local spiritual site known for hosting lively Iwami Kagura performances—traditional Shinto music and dance that bring ancient legends to life. Then explore Tsuwano, a picturesque castle town often called the “Little Kyoto of San’in,” where koi-filled canals, samurai residences, and the hilltop Taikodani Inari Shrine create a timeless atmosphere.

## Sasebo

Sasebo opens the door to Hirado, a historic port where Portuguese traders, Dutch merchants, and Korean artisans once shaped Japan's connection to the wider world. Hilltop castle views, centuries-old Catholic churches built by communities who kept their faith alive through periods of persecution, and nearby Arita — birthplace of the porcelain that 18th-century Europe knew and coveted as "Imari ware" — make this one of the voyage's most layered and memorable calls.

- On boarding the ship, guests are asked to register a credit card to cover onboard expenditure (accepted cards: VISA, MasterCard, American Express, Diners Club, JCB).

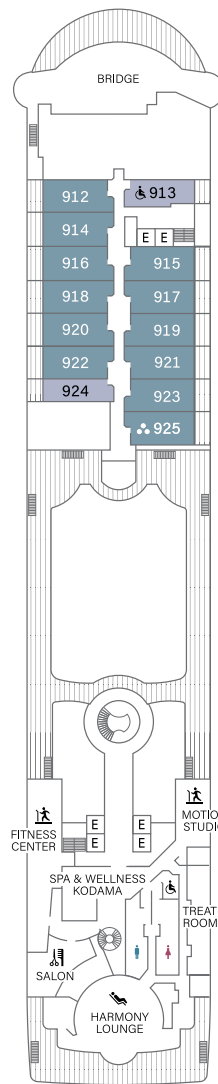

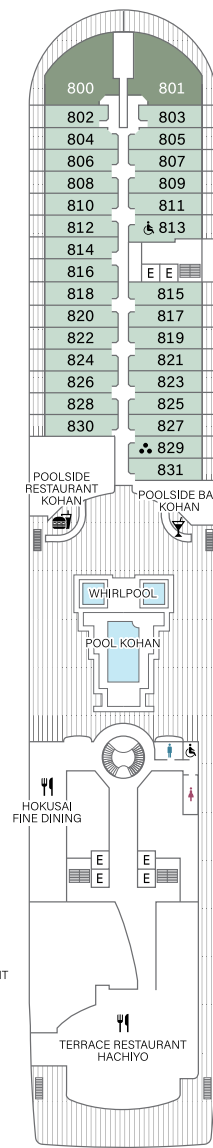

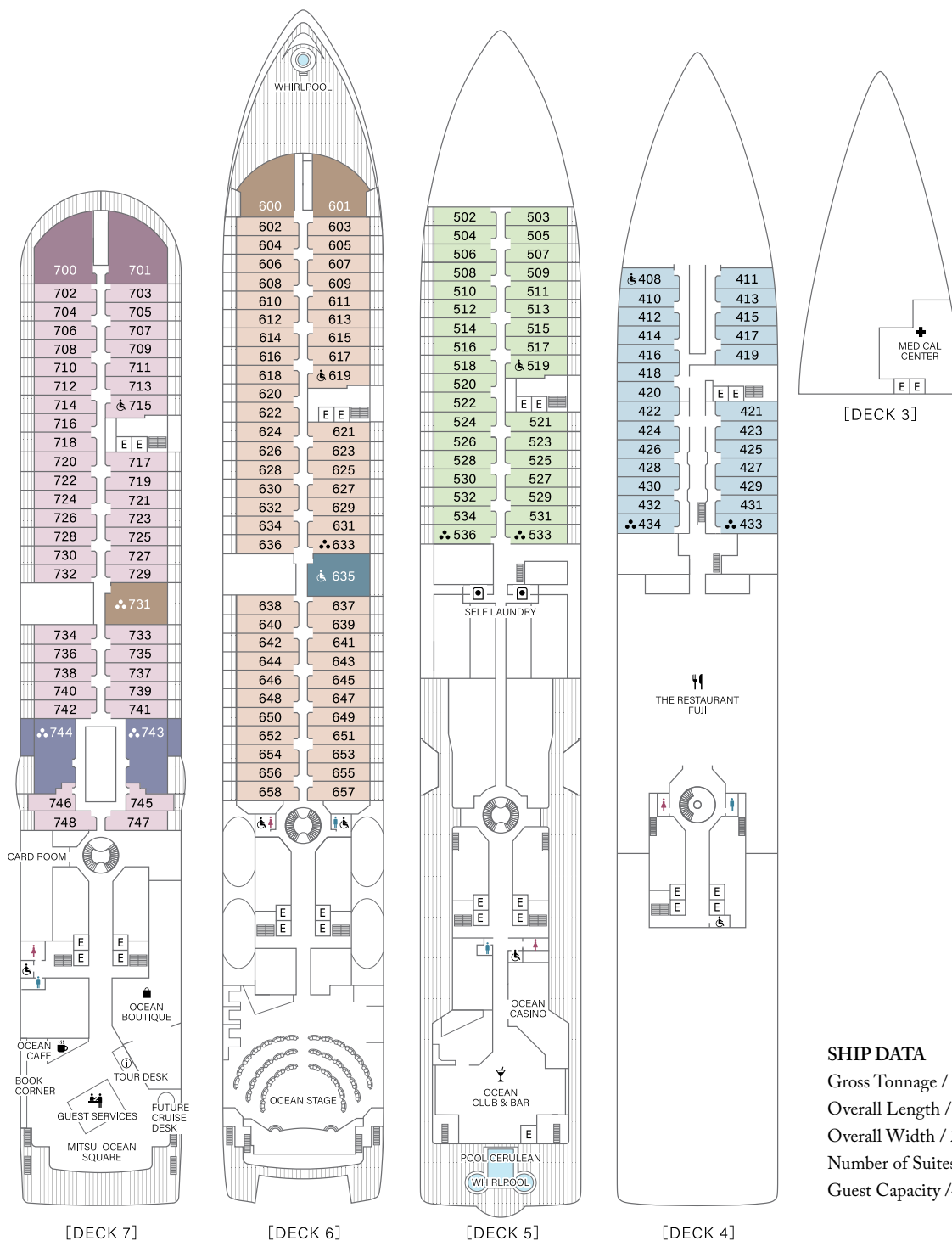
